The Village Board and staff have approached the fiscal impact of the COVID pandemic by: (i) assessing the expected gap in Village revenues, (ii) identifying sources of funds to cover the expected gap in revenues, (iii) preparing a downside scenario to the expected revenue gap, (iv) identifying sources of funds to cover the downside revenue estimate, and (v) using budget items that have identified savings to reduce the tax levy.	
The Village Board and staff have now achieved meaningful progress on all fronts, having identified likely and downside revenue shortfalls and sources to cover those shortfalls as well as identifying over \$200,000 of budget adjustments to the library budget that will result from the delayed opening of the library to provide taxpayer relief.	
The Village Board and staff are committed to prudent fiscal management and clearly understand the challenges faced by Scarsdale residents. The Village is very fortunate to have a long-standing tradition of prudent fiscal management that has provided us with the financial flexibility to manage this economic shock.
