Alan Steinfeld here. I'm writing on behalf of several families, my own included, who live on Carthage Road. We have become concerned about what appears to us to be an increase in the number of cars that speed on Carthage, particularly on the stretch between the stop sign at Fayette Road and the Heathcote intersection. This problem has become particularly notable now that the weather has warmed and more people are out walking. Over the past few years, an influx of new families with children means that there are more strollers and small bicycles and kids

walking to and from Heathcote School. Add to this the old timers, like myself, who are out for morning constitutionals, and the observant Jewish people walking to Young Israel, and there can be quite a bit of foot traffic.

Cars heading towards Heathcote Road can accelerate quickly after the stop sign on Fayette, especially if they have not stopped fully. While this is less of a problem on weekdays when parked cars serve to limit the speed at which it is safe to travel, weekends often see more cars zipping by.

We would like the East Heathcote Neighborhood Association to assist us in bringing this problem to the attention of the Village government. Our immediate goal to to arrange a meeting with the appropriate Village authority to discuss the situation and possible remedies. Can you help?
