Thank you for your email.

I have been in direct contact with our State Assemblywoman about the potential to postpone the election. As you know, the Village must and will follow State election law or a directive from the Governor. At this juncture, we have not heard anything to the contrary about the election and we are continuing to plan for an election on March 18th, which would include safety measures such as cleaning throughout the day and social distancing of people queueing to place their ballots, among other things.

If there are any changes to the election by the Governor or the State Legislature, we will promptly post that information on the Village website.

The Village remains committed to public safety, while abiding by State law. In the event that the election is held on March 18th, there will be ample supplies of sanitizer, social distancing will be in place and Village staff will clean the polling area throughout the day. The Village also invites people to bring their own pens, sanitizer and/or gloves to the polling location.
