Yesterday, I noticed two signs indicating that in the future a permit will be required to park a motorcycle at the villager Scarsdale train station. I respectfully ask why is the policy changing? For over 50 years motorcycle parking has been free at Scarsdale. This year, on average 5 to 6 people park motorcycles or scooters at the Scarsdale train station – a reduction of about 60% from prior years. There are plenty of spots available. I would like to know why Scarsdale is now requiring a permit, and why this change is necessary? I would ask that you rethink this change. I also believe that with the reduced number of people riding motorcycles and scooters and the limited time when one can write a motorcycle or scooter (due to the rain and cold weather) that this change in policy if it was done to generate revenue will produce very little revenue. Again, I would ask that the villager Scarsdale not resurface the motorcycle parking area and that require permits to park. Jim
