Interestingly, we discovered last night that the picture of people selling bats in the market that the doctor used for his presentation was from " Bat for sale at Indonesia's wildlife market despite virus warning – France 24 (https://www.france24.com/en/20200212-bat-for-sale-at-indonesia-s-wildlife-market-despitevirus-warning?from=singlemessage&isappinstalled=0) This is a very irresponsive behavior as a public speaker talking about the serious public health crisis. He was supposed to be in Scarsdale to provide his professional knowledge to help us to prepare well for the coronavirus outbreak. He should not be here to spread the rumors and misinformation to mislead the public. He has lost his credibility to provide reliable information. His talk is unprofessional, insulting, harmful, and it's not acceptable completely.

I accepted the apology from the mayor, but the damage was done. What our Chinese community have worried the most is the consequence. What would our children have to deal with when they come back to school? What could happen when the kids talk about what they heard from their parent's discussions on the talk today? or how they will react to the doctor's opinions broadcasted? I sincerely hope that the mayor and the board trustees will do something to repair the damages.

I personally don't think this is a racial issue. This is about what is right or wrong. What the truce is? It's about the compassion and sympathy for the people in the pain. This is about the justice. It's about the American values all of us always stand by.
